Over the summer I attended a week at Beaver Cross Summer Camp. I thought it was a really fun experience. In the middle of camper choice A and B we would go to the canteen and get a snack and drink. When camper choice B was over you walked back to the dining hall for dinner.

After dinner the entire camp would walk to the pavilion for the camp game, where everyone in the camp (even councilors) played a game. Over the week we played clue, capture the flag, gold rush, and in the middle of the week had a campfire. Lights out was about 10-11ish. My experience at Beaver Cross was amazing! My best friend and I had so much fun, and are looking forward to going again next year. I would encourage anyone to go to camp!
