As I write these short blurbs, I sometimes wonder why I focus so much on the weather. This time of year, which I personally think is so beautiful, I see God's hands in everything. From the many shades of green against the blue-blue sky and puffy white clouds to the flowering trees of pink and white. Tiny lilies of the valley with tulips, daffodils, jonquils and violets are popping up in yards along with colorful phlox.

God also gives us all the birds, ducks, geese, and turkeys along with their young. The other day in a parking lot, I saw a female duck – don't know where her nest was – but she was checking everything out. Sort of like what we do – we check a lot of things out - our surroundings, our kids, their friends and lots of other things but do we do we check in with God too?

Now when I'm driving from my home to wherever, I have a little mantra that I recite: "Thank you God ...". Sometimes I thank God for just getting me up in time so I won't be late. DEACON'S MESSAGE

Hallelujah! Christ is Risen!

For the past several weeks we have opened all of our services with "Hallelujah! Christ is risen!"

And the response from the congregation is "The Lord is risen indeed, Hallelujah!"

It is interesting to note that although we declare this, many Christians today fail to live into its meaning. Good Friday and Easter are overwhelmingly significant. This past Thursday we celebrated Ascension Day, a day that should be just as significant to Christians as Easter and Good Friday yet it is often overlooked. However, Good Friday, Easter and Ascension are all invariably linked; remove any one of them and we risk dismissing Jesus as possibly a charlatan or a con artist but definitely not God. With no Good Friday there is no Resurrection; with no Resurrection there is no Ascension; no Ascension – no Church. Each element leads to the next and ultimately to you and me.

In the early 4th century, the priest Arius denied the divinity of Christ. He claimed that Jesus Christ was like God, but was not really God. He fashioned a Christ acceptable to the non-Christian world, to both the Jewish people and the pagans. You could say Arianism was the first "ecumenical" religion. Millions were led astray by this charismatic priest, including four out of five bishops according to St. Jerome, and two-thirds of all priests.

Easter is the beginning of our new life; but Ascension Day is the beginning of our new ministry. It may be the day we celebrate Jesus' ascension to His Father, but it is also the day that He is leaving us to start acting on his instructions. Jesus said that we would do greater things than He has done because He was going to His Father, but sometimes doubt that this can happen creeps into our thoughts. We look at dwindling Sunday attendance at churches across the United States and diminishing church bank accounts worried that there will be no way to keep the lights on, instead of trusting that God can do all things. When we despair we have started to believe "the lie" because we stop believing in God's omnipotence.

Yes, we have to act on the call Christ has given each of us, but we must trust that He grows the fruit! We cannot be wishy-washy about Who Christ is, or we risk falling into heresy. If we accept that Christ is God then all that has been said and done by Him and by the apostles supports us to trust that He will continue to grow His Church and nothing can stand against it.

The Lord is risen indeed, Hallelujah!
