It is with joy that I can share with you the appointment of Father Frank Lockwood as Our Saviour's Priest-in-Charge. All of a sudden, things can change dramatically – sometimes you just know eventually they will change and other times, God just drops changes out of the blue! That was what it was like last Saturday when Bishop Love gave the Vestry the opportunity to have Fr. Frank Lockwood as our Priest-in-Charge. What a wonderful gift God has given to Church of Our Saviour!

Lots of parishioners already know Father Frank since he has been with us every third Sunday for about a year. But now, he'll be with us every Sunday at the 8 AM service starting soon. What a blessing for our parish. The burden on Deacon Randy will be lessened too, allowing him more time to focus on his seminary studies. We will keep you all posted as to when everything becomes "official"!

As you know, our fantastic craft leader, Debi, signed us up for Operation Christmas Child! This is a great program which allows everyone the opportunity to share our Christian love with children around the world. Why they even let (no talent) me help! What we did was wrap shoeboxes with pretty Christmas paper and then fill it with donated items for boys and girls in age groups from 2 to 14. There were big and little socks, crayons and pencils, paper, small toys, small books, stuffed animals, pencil sharpeners and pop up cloths when wet. It was amazing how much stuff can be jammed into a shoebox! I volunteered to deliver the completed boxes to the assembly point in Pittsfield.

What a production line we had packing the boxes – two wrapping (one was very, very slow – ME and the other was a speed demon). Others filled the boxes from the wealth of donated items and labeled the box. Since you cannot seal the boxes, we used large rubber bands to keep the lids on. When I delivered the boxes to the assembly point, I was amazed at how many boxes had been delivered and this was only the first day! There was a table full of filled boxes which were checked for labeling and then packed into big cartons for shipping. It was fantastic! We were so blessed with a generous donation from a parishioner to help with the cost of shipping. The women's group made up the difference.

I know some of you would have joined us to help with the "Stuffing" so keep it in mind for next year. I found a lot of fantastic stuff at the dollar stores so I'm thinking to shop all year to get some of the items. Debi can provide a list of things that we can include.

We do have lots to be thankful for this year. We are truly blessed – and we're also part of a blessing to children. Join us for our service and reconnect or connect with Father Frank and then join us for just coffee or breakfast and camaraderie at Jimmy D's.
