Mission Projects:

Backpack Program: The church is again participating in this program. Children who meet the income guidelines are provided with food for them to eat over the weekends or holidays when school is not in session. The cost for a year of backpacks is \$228. To join, give a check to the church with Backpack program in the memo line, the Treasurer will submit a check to the Regional Food Bank in December and mark it for New Lebanon Central.

Samaritan's Purse Shoebox Ministry: We will pack 11 boxes to send to children around the world to celebrate Christmas. Join us on Sunday November 20th after church service to pack the shoeboxes. Mary will take them for shipping. Eugenia reports we need the following items: Crayon Boxes/ Combs/Balls/Small Cars/ Coloring Books/Colored Pencils/Pencil Sharpeners/Rulers/ Glue Sticks/Adhesive Bandages/Scarfs/ Mittens/Hair Bows/Plastic Containers (small)/Dolls/ Sunglasses/ Toy Musical Instruments. **Food Pantry**: We continue to collect food for our neighbors who need assistance. A food basket is located in the back of the sanctuary. Eugenia delivers the food twice a month to Charlie's Pantry for distribution.

Domestic Shelters: We continue to collect personal hygiene items for the victims of domestic violence living in shelters. The box is in the back of the sanctuary. We gave two large boxes this month.

Blessing of the Animals: It was wonderful to have seven families bring their pets to the church to be blessed last October 2nd. We had a good time with the pets and they and their owners were treated to sweets for the afternoon.

Trunk or Treat: Shatford Park October 28th 5:30-7pm. New Lebanon gathers at Shatford Park to provide children with a safe place and way to celebrate Halloween. Father decorates his truck and parishioners give out candy. If you are interested in participating talk to Richard Dauchy.

Drug Awareness Program: The Vestry voted to send \$102 to the Columbia County Sheriff's office to help them participate in a program to teach children drug awareness and how to prevent and avoid violence here in Columbia County.

From Father Frank Lockwood

Hello Brothers and Sisters,

I pray this finds you well. So much going on and so little "time" to get things done. Yet, time is no different than it always has been. It is my own perception that changes things and how much I attempt to "squeeze in" that affects that perception.

Fall is my favorite time of year. It is a time of transition. It is like the evening of the year. The critters are getting ready for their winter's nap. The trees shed the weight of their leaves as they prepare to face the snows and winds of winter. Harvest festivals are going on all around us reminding us of our ties to what grows from the ground.

The smells are probably some of the most powerful elements of the fall. Hot cider donuts, the crispness of that first frosty morning and the smell of the leaves. Oh, how I love the smell of leaves both when dry and first falling and when damp after an October/November rain. The smell of the forest for some reason reminds me of a blanket that seems to wrap around me whenever I get a chance to walk through it.

Yet all of this is nothing more than perception. A dear friend of mine from another parish passed away a few years ago. She and I would sharply disagree on our perceptions of fall. Where I find it my favorite season, for her it was her least favorite. She viewed it as nature dying with the leaves coming off the trees. She saw the prediction of snow not as a blanket that freshens our view but as a near prison. It represented for her just how uncomfortable she was going to be for the next several months, trapped like a prisoner in her home because she would struggle with the cold and getting outside during the upcoming months. Her favorite season was summer. She loved the heat. Her favorite vacations were going on cruises in the Caribbean. Here we were. We were in the same time, same space and looking at the same things, yet we saw them in diametrically opposed views.

A challenge we face in this life, including our religious beliefs, is being open to sharing that differing perspective. It doesn't mean we have to agree, but can we at least hear it? Are we able to recognize that sometimes, it simply is a matter of personal preference that is interpreting the same situation one way for one person and completely differently for someone else?

As we prepare to celebrate Thanksgiving at the end of November, I would ask a favor of you. This year, would you please add to your Thanksgiving a giving of thanks for those things that have challenged us? Giving thanks for those opinions and viewpoints and perspectives that are the absolute opposite of our own and make us uncomfortable? After all, having our viewpoints challenged, leaves us with only two possible outcomes: either we will strengthen our view, or we will see our view from a slightly different vantage point.
