We are looking to be good stewards of our world and our finances now and in the future.

<u>Charlies Pantry:</u> Our members give nonperishable food items and household supplies as well as support the fuel fund. A food basket for donations is located in the back of the sanctuary. Eugenia delivers the food twice a month to Charlie's Pantry for distribution. This Pantry is open to the community in need on Saturdays.

Domestic Shelters: Members give personal hygiene products for the residents of the shelter to use. In addition, this month we are collecting blankets, sheets, and towels for the shelter to use.

<u>Animal Assistance</u>: We are partnering with a group of young people whom Bitsy has been teaching. We are helping with their service project collecting items that might be used in an animal shelter. Food, toys, blankets, soap, brushes, and combs to name a few. The students will give these items to the Pittsfield animal shelter.

Bates Fund Raiser: The Bruce Bates family home was destroyed by fire on February 11th. We thank God that no one was hurt, but everything is gone. The Bates have been members of our parish and they and their children and grandchildren were active members. Right now, until further information can be obtained, a financial collection is being made. You may drop off a financial contribution at Mavericks in New Lebanon, send a check to the town clerk or donate on the Go-Fund-Me page set up by their son on Facebook. The Town will be opening the free store and the Columbia County Burned-out Victims Fund will be available, if needed.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ;

Welcome to Lent. I am writing this the morning of Ash Wednesday so I am uncertain if I am going to make the deadline for the newsletter. One of my faults is getting distracted by tasks in the moment. I will often have in mind to complete the article. Unfortunately, this often comes while I'm driving someplace. I even have great ideas for what to write only to arrive at whatever destination and get pulled into something else and lose track of what I was going to do.

So, here I am.

I have tried to come up with something profound to write about for you all this month. I have been unable to do so. Well, that's not completely true. I do have much to write, however, much of it would likely be controversial.

Today, instead, I would like to simply offer a personal insight. My favorite time of the day is the morning. I absolutely love the sunrise. Today as I was driving it was so beautiful. Sunrise is so simple a time of day. The way the light breaks out orange to start. As the rise progresses the color changes to gold as the tops of the trees and the tops of hills are lit up. I so enjoy the feeling of the warming as the light intensifies.

The world begins to stir and waken. Not in a rush but ever so slowly. When I go hunting, it isn't anywhere near as much as about the hunt, as it is about sitting there while the woods awake around me. I love the feeling of sitting there watching as things begin to stir.

I also love the smell of the frost as the sun hits it. Even the smell of the dew as it begins to warm up and rise. The smell is one of comfort, invitation, as the temperatures continue to rise there is a wonderful warmth that begins to surround me. It almost feels like a warm robe covering me.

Sounds are so soft at the first. Little rustles of leaves from smaller animals. The soft chirp of a bird. The wing flap as one takes to flight. Combine that with a cup of coffee, preferably a Columbian blend or even an espresso, and I feel such peace.
