Programs:

<u>Charlies Pantry:</u> Our members give nonperishable food items and household supplies as well as support the fuel fund. A food basket for donations is located in the back of the sanctuary. Eugenia delivers the food twice a month to Charlie's Pantry for distribution. This Pantry is open to the community in need on Saturdays.

Domestic Shelters: Members give personal hygiene products for the residents of the shelter to use. In addition, this month we are collecting blankets, sheets, and towels for the shelter to use.

Animal Assistance: We are partnering with a group of young people whom Bitsy has been teaching. We are helping with their service project collecting items that might be used in an animal shelter. Food, toys, blankets, soap, brushes, and combs to name a few. The students will give these items to the Pittsfield animal shelter.

Bates Fund Raiser: The Bruce Bates family home was destroyed by fire on February 11th. We thank God that no one was hurt, but everything is gone. The Bates have been members of our parish and they and their children and grandchildren were active members. Right now, until further information can be obtained, a financial collection is being made. You may drop off a financial contribution at Mavericks in New Lebanon, send a check to the town clerk or donate on the Go-Fund-Me page set up by their son on Facebook. The Town will be opening the free store and the Columbia County Burned-out Victims Fund will be available, if needed.

From Father Frank Lockwood

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

Here we are in the first part of Spring, aka Mud Season, post Easter. The trees have already blossomed. The fruit tree in the front of the rectory has already showed the first flowers and the new branches have sprung up around the base. We have even had some way above seasonal norm temperatures as a way of teasing us with a taste of summer.

This coming summer I will be part of the team for Cursillo 77. For those unfamiliar with Cursillo, it is a faith encouraging weekend that began, I believe, in the 1970's. It is for adults and primarily led by lay people with some support from clergy. It is lay people sharing their faith with lay people in hope of encouraging a deeper faith.

Related to this is a youth weekend known as Happening. I attended when I was 17 and was on team for one when I was 18. The Happening was about teenagers speaking with teenagers about faith. Again, encouraging a deepening of faith and perhaps even a decrease of the usual shame felt by some teenagers over their faith. Not an easy task, having teenagers gathered together in one house for a whole weekend and having them remain focused on faith and not on "other things".

The Cursillo weekends are normally done as a male only and female only weekend. The design being intentional in order to promote more openness in discussions. The weekend begins on a Friday and runs through to Sunday afternoon. There are several talks, named Rollos, that are given throughout the weekend on numerous topics. There are also small group discussions and activities that take place.

Why go? Well, that depends upon what it is that you want to get out of your faith. What I mean is that I realize each person is going to have their own relationship with God and express it in such a way that is personal to them. Some people are quiet in their faith, never really sharing it or talking about it. Perhaps, even quietly studying on their own or maybe not studying at all but instead taking in what they hear on a Sunday or see in some random movie. Whereas others might be more outspoken by what they feel or more active in their seeking knowledge. Whatever it is, well...it is.

For those that perhaps want a bit more or if their faith has waned, a Cursillo weekend could be an opportunity to encourage that faith to wax. Certainly, there will be bits and pieces of information to be gained alongside differing perspectives of faith and approach to the church. If you would like to talk more, please let me know.
